PhD 2024 Applications

- There are three departments involved in astrophysics/cosmology research
 - Institute of Astronomy, Cavendish Astrophysics, DAMTP
- University requires a separate application for each department
- Institute of Astronomy 5 December 2023
- Cavendish Astrophysics (Physics) 5 December 2023
 - research project descriptions available on-line
- DAMTP check with department
 - HEP/GR/Cosmology group
 - 15 December 2023 can arrange to take the "admissions test" in January 2024
 - Astrophysics group (small) mostly discs

PhD 2024 Admissions Timetable

- Institute Application deadline
 - 5 December 2023 for **all** applications
 - Not sensible to leave until the last day
 - You will likely be disadvantaged if your two (or three for Gates) references are not available on 5 December
- Other UK and non-UK universities
 - Most, but not all, operate on a similar time line. Do not restrict applications to just one university

- Assessed on academic grounds
 - Your interests and skill-set relative to research undertaken in the Institute
 - Make clear in "Statement of Interests"
 - Availability of supervisors in each research area (list of potential supervisors on website)
 - Competition for limited number of places such that academic attainment needs to be equivalent to a strong first-class performance at masters level

- Institute participates in University contextual-information pilot
- Provides background information including non-academic circumstances
- You are all at a very advanced stage
- Information could relate to academic performance
- We do need evidence about abilities

- Post-submission process from 5 December
 - Overseas-fee students
 - Academic record
 - Statement of Interests in application form
 - Availability of supervisors in each research area (list of potential supervisors on website)
 - Most promising applicants contacted by potential supervisor(s)
 - References
 - Generate a project description
 - Interview with Admissions Committee

- Overseas-fee students (continued)
 - Strongest students (both for supervisor and Admission Committee) ranked according to University scoring system
 - Top-scoring students submitted for University scholarships, Gates,...
 - All completed by end of January 2024

- Home-fee students
 - Will also be considered as per Overseas-fee students BUT
 - Prospect of success very small and even then only for a few students
 - Selection for interview in late February and award of STFC Ph.D. places based on academic record, references and general research interests

- Offers of admission for Overseas- and just possibly one or two Home-fee students in February
- Actual award/success in University funding competition are separate
- Unfortunately the options for full funding vary depending on University Fee status
 - Home
 - Ireland
 - Overseas

 "Home" fee status based on residence in the UK or Ireland or EU nationals with Settled or Pre-settled status under the EU Settlement Scheme (EUSS)

Is anyone unclear about their University fee status?

 Institute "Ph.D Programme" pages on the website contain all the information you will need about applying

- In practice, given the cost of a Ph.D. (~£90k Home ~£170k Overseas), funding availability is key for most applicants
- Unfortunately the fraction of students who can be allocated scholarships/funding is small compared to the number who apply [and could obtain a strong Ph.D.]
- Make sure that you apply to multiple universities where research matches your interests

PhD 2024 Admissions Process

- Will run through the process for each of the fee catagories
- Includes numbers of scholarships and probability of success

PhD 2024: Home Fee Status

- Small probability of University scholarship awards – nomination end January
- Probably 4 or 5 STFC Ph.D. awards
- An additional ~2 STFC CDT data-science Ph.D. awards
- Interviews will be held in week26 February 1 March [in person]
- Offers from early March with everything tied-up by 31 March (STFC deadline)

PhD 2024: Home Fee Status

- Academic Competition
 - Is significant and normally offers made to students with first-class degree expectation
 - Some Part III/MASt students with 2:i performance and expectation of firstclass degree competitive
 - Not normally true for 2:ii performance and definitely not true if interested in theoretical topics (e.g. cosmology)
 - Few projects in theoretical cosmology

Institute of Astronomy: Home students, funding, projects and supervisors

- ~20 potential Ph.D. Supervisors
- ~ 40 (or more) potential projects
- Total of about 12 new Ph.D. Students
- Supervisor/project rich : student poor
- Not obvious that Ph.D. choice related to topic of your final year project (or best lecture course) is optimal

Institute of Astronomy: Students, projects and supervisors

- Taking time to identify the right project / supervisor / work methodology is really worthwhile
- Normally, for Home-fee students we do not match students to project/supervisor on admission
- Students encouraged to spend first term exploring research topic, style, supervisors to identify a good match
- Possible because of STFC awards and no UK Government immigration issues

PhD 2024: Ireland

- Possibility of University scholarship awardsnomination end January
- Also STFC Ph.D. studentships
- Some interviews late January and maybe also February
- Offers from early March with everything tied-up by 31 March (STFC deadline)
- Students are unique as eligible for STFC funding and "University" scholarship funding

PhD 2024: Overseas Fee Status

- ATAS (Academic Technology Approval Scheme) for many Overseas students required
- Nominations for scholarships (end January 2024)
 require supervisor and project description
- Must match applicants to supervisors December and January for supervisor and project identification
- Supervisors should be interested in engaging and will expect you to contribute to develop a project description
- Students are eligible for one or two STFC studentships [extra fees from the University]

PhD 2024: Overseas Fee Status

- The uncomfortable reality check is that competition for scholarships from the University is extreme
- For University/College scholarships you will need
 - An outstanding academic record
 - Two very strong references of some length
 - Research experience outside of your academic course to even be competitive

PhD 2024: Overseas Fee Status

- To apply, simply tick the funding box on the form. Gates - tick box and complete the 500 word statement
- Contextual information aside, there are almost no exceptions to the requirements on last slide
- If you have an impressive (as opposed to outstanding) academic record then
 - Some "Developing world" scholarships
 - Gates Cambridge look at additional factors

Overseas Referee Choice

- Referee choice for Overseas applicants
 - Extent of referee letters is an important factor for University scholarship awards
 - A "Cambridge" reference is not helpful if it says very little
 - Current MASt/Part III Project involvement normally modest – only very rarely is it sensible to choose your project supervisor
 - Consider reference from summer project or research internment
 - One academic and one research normally good

PhD 2024 Gates Applications

- IoA allowed only one nomination
- You must be able to write the 500 word statement with significant "leadership" and "helping others" content
- Your personal (third) referee should be able to comment on the leadership and helping aspects
- Do not use one of your academic referees as your personal referee [only very rarely appropriate]

PhD 2024 Additional Funding Options for Overseas students

- College awards choose your college and apply. Effectively only one option [your first choice on form]
- Talk to your graduate tutor about options with your current college
- Own country competitions down to you to identify.
 - For suitable qualified students we can help via the project and supervisor links [you have identified]
